Sergt. GEORGE WILSON

Intimation has been received that Sergt. George Wilson, formerly of the Argyll and Sutherland Highlanders and latterly with a Commando unit, has been killed in action. Deceased was 35 years of age and was the second son of Mr and Mrs Wm. Wilson, 2 Grahams-hill Terrace, Fankerton, Denny. The official intimation was received by his wife, who resides at 17 Fankerton, Denny. Two children also mourn the loss of their father. Sgt. Wilson before the war was a member of the Stirlingshire Territorials, and his brother, Private W. Wilson, also of the Argyll and Sutherland Highlanders, has been a prisoner of war in Germany since the evacuation from France. After going abroad, Sergt. G. Wilson was stationed at Gibraltar for about six months during the course of last year. He was a keen athlete and, besides doing much cycling in civil life, he played a good deal of football and did a bit of wrestling during his Army life. Previous to his mobilisation, he was an employee of the Carrongrove Paper Co., Ltd., Denny. This is the second bereavement occasioned by the war that his wife has sustained, her brother Corporal Alex. W. Turnbull, Argyll and Sutherland Highlanders, having fallen in the battle of El Alamein towards the end of 1942.
